RADIOGRAPHIC SCREENING

The following radiographic prepurchase examination was performed:

- Young horse appendicular radiographic prepurchase examination includes both front feet (LM, D55°PrPDO and D65°PrPDO), both front and hind fetlocks (LM), both hocks (D30°LPIMO, D45°MPILO and LM) and stifles (LM, Ca30°LCrMO).
- Axial radiographic prepurchase examination includes the neck (LL), the vertebral spinous processes of the thoraco-lumbar spine (LL) and vertebral bodies of the thoracic spine (LL).

Radiographic remarks

Radiographic remarks only include abnormal findings.

There are no significant radiographic abnormalities.

CONCLUSION

In my opinion, within the limits of today's exam, and as the horse is presented to me, there is normal medical risk for the intended use as a sports horse.
